SUBJECT: CBP Processing and Possible Delays Due To COVID-19

U.S. Customs and Border Protection's (CBP) highest priority is to ensure the health, safety and security of our workforce and the American people. CBP officers will maintain situational awareness while identifying individuals who have traveled from or transited through countries affected by COVID-19.

CBP continues to process cargo as there has been no identified threat as it relates to cargo shipments; however, due to the increase of COVID-19 cases in the area, it could impact CBP staffing levels at the port of Savannah and Brunswick, which in-turn could cause external stakeholders to experience delays in the processing of vessels, crew, and cargo.

Currently Savannah and Brunswick are not experiencing the obstacles that other ports nationwide are experiencing due to COVID-19. We are monitoring the situation daily here in Savannah and Brunswick for any possible changes.
